Children we serve are between the ages of 5-17yrs and can be as young as 4yrs depending on case specifics/needs. If the child meets those requirements, a referral from their Primary Behavioral Health agency can then be submitted to our office.

**Intake Process:** Once the referral is received with all required documents to treat, the appropriate site manager will contact the parents/guardian to set up services that best fit their needs.
