

# FYI

## Requirements to register:

- 18 years old by the time of the next Federal General Election
- U.S. citizen & able to document it by either providing one of the following numbers:
  - ⇒ AZ drivers license or non-operating ID
  - ⇒ Naturalization number
  - ⇒ Bureau of Indian Affairs Number, Indian Census Number, Tribal Treaty Card Number, or Tribal Enrollment Number, or
- Provide a copy of one of the following:
  - ⇒ Birth Certificate
  - ⇒ Applicable pages of a United States Passport
- Resident of Arizona & the county on registration form

## You cannot register if:

Convicted of more than 1 felony and have not had civil rights restored, (If it is the first conviction, the individual may re-register once all probationary requirements are met. Rights are not automatically restored if it is the second felony conviction or more, the court must be petitioned), or adjudicated incompetent.

# Voter Registration Information



## You must update your registration if:

- Move or change Post Office box
- Name change
- Political Party affiliation change
- Your signature changes

Once you are registered you do not need to provide citizenship documentation to update your registration; it is only necessary the first time you register in a county. If you move within the county, just re-register. If you move to another county you need to provide citizenship documentation again.

## I don't have a street address, what do I do?

Rural registrants or those without a physical address need to give a descriptive location so that they can be placed in a voting precinct. The bottom right corner of the form contains an area to draw where they reside. It is also helpful if someone else is registered who lives there (or nearby) to note their information.

## Resolution of Insufficient Registrations:

Insufficient Registrations received by our office are sent:

- A letter informing the registrant what issue they need to resolve along with a new registration form.
- The registrant has until 7 PM on Election Day to provide correct information.
- If citizenship information is missing the form is rejected completely.

## Do I have to register to a politic party?

### What if I don't?

Currently, the four recognized parties in Arizona are: Democrat, Green Party, Libertarian, and Republican.

Check with your county for any other locally recognized parties. You do not have to select a party preference. If you fail to do so or select a party other than one of the recognized parties, in the Primary Election, you can choose which party's ballot you want to vote.

In order to vote in the Presidential Preference Election, you will have to be registered to a political party having an election. Unlike in our Primary, you will not be able to declare a party at the polls on Election Day for the preference election.



### When can I register?

The registration deadline is **29 days before each election.**

You may register at anytime, but if it is after the 29th day, you are

not eligible to vote in that election.

## How does the voter know they are registered?

Voters will receive a Voter ID card 1-3 weeks after their registration is received. Voters should verify that all the information is correct and contact our office if it is not.

## Why should I register?

Who are you voting for if you don't vote? Elected officials determine policy and funding for schools, parks, law enforcement, military, social services, and roads. You will have the ability to sign nomination and initiative petitions which determines what is on the ballot. You have the ability to elect local representation.
