MINUTES

**FROM CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION BOARD MEETING THAT WAS HELD ON
Thursday November 18, 2021,** Victim Witness Office, Basement Level 800 W. Main Street .

The Crime Victim Compensation Board members, Felicia Herber, Kendall Curtis, Michael Andazola & Jessei MacIntire Victim Advocate Coordinator and Elvira Talavera victim advocate were timely, present, and ready for the presentation of business.

The Crime Victim Compensation Board members were presented with facts of each case. These facts were obtained by each individual police reports then presented to the board members by Jessei MacIntire, Graham County Attorney's Victim/Witness Advocate along with supported documentation (Cost estimate of the Victims Dental Expenses) for each request of compensation. II: Introduction of new business:

- 1) Claim # 10032021-001. Requirements of claimant to be eligible for victim compensation was shared by Victim Comp Coordinator Jessei MacIntire. with new Board Members as cited in page 30 of the Victim Compensation Manual.
After much discussion of the case, it was cited that there was no crime since the defendant was not cited or charged and the case was officially dismissed. Various discussion was had by the board members as to what specifically the victim was asking for compensation for injuries, counseling, loss of property from damage, etc.....

All Board Members voted unanimously to decline the victim's compensation based on the fact there was not crime committed according to R10-4101.9 regulation code and no injurious crime found to be committed.

--Constitutes a crime as defined by the state and federal law regardless of whether the perpetrator of the conduct is apprehended, charged, or convicted.

--Poses a substantial threat of physical injury, mental distress, or death; and

--Is punishable by a fine, imprisonment or death or would be punishable by the perpetrator of the conduct lacked the capacity to commit the crime under applicable laws.

3rd motion was made by Kendall Curtis to deny the claim.
