eAccess Available for Superior Court Civil and Criminal Cases

On 05/10/19 Chief Justice Scott Bales signed Administrative Order 2019-48 implementing eAccess statewide, for all Arizona Superior Court locations.

The eAccess web portal uses technology to provide convenient online access to case documents and information for the public attorneys, and government users.

The web portal offers online access to Arizona court case records and documents on a subscription or per document fee basis, as well as allowing for the purchase of certified copies.



Benefits of eAccess Service

- ◆ Provides online access to court case records and documents* 24/7
- ◆ Provides a safe, secure, and easy option to purchase court case documents
- ◆ Provides the ability to purchase an electronically certified document along with the ability for any entity to electronically verify the authenticity of any certified document purchased within eAccess
- ◆ Reduces the amount of time or resources used to travel to the courthouse by offering a more efficient way to access case data or documents
- ◆ Discounted cost for service based upon volume of documents needed

*eAccess will not provide access to any document image that is sealed or otherwise restricted by law, rule, or court order.

What is available...

- ◆ Superior Court Civil and Criminal case records from all 15 counties*
- ◆ Ability to obtain electronically certified documents
- ◆ Ability to electronically verify the authenticity of a certified document

*Pima county data is expected to be available in the Fall of 2019

Is everything I can access at the clerk's office available through eAccess?

No. Rule 123 (g) prohibits some case record information for remote electronic access. Please visit or contact the appropriate Clerk of the Superior Court office for specific case record inquiries, not available in eAccess.
